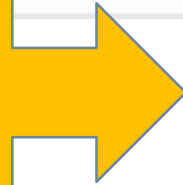

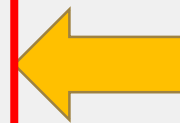

To gain a quantitative understanding of the effect of MCO on the dynamics of COVID-19, this paper develops a class of mathematical models to capture the disease spread before and after MCO implementation.

Abstract

Purpose – The COVID-19 pandemic has placed online learning in a “non-normal” state in Higher Education. For most universities and the strong online presence, the pandemic has caused numerous changes and resiting of priorities. For academic librarians in Higher Education, a renewed mission is emerging, addressing access, equity, education and fostering the development of digital literacy competences.

Design/methodology/approach – This is a conceptual paper based on the author’s view and subjective opinion as a Library and Information Science researcher in distance learning in the UK. Reflecting critically on the impact of the pandemic and on key changes experienced, the paper centres on how academic libraries emerge as strategic partners in Higher Education, towards digital literacy competences development.

Findings – The complete and involuntary shift to online learning has opened the door to multiple challenges in Higher Education, which are addressed through tools and practices *en masse* in online teaching and learning. The paper discusses all issues connecting to online pedagogy and how to prepare students for the competences required for the new online learning. The paper outlines a renewed mission to help learners in the online space to become digital literate. There is an opportunity to act as the connecting link that will help to place design for equity at the centre of education.

Originality/value – The impact of COVID-19 within Higher Education, specifically, is a theme that has not been yet sufficiently discussed.
